MAKE IT STICK

One Word at a Time — Write (or have your child write) each word of the memory verses on separate sticky notes. Standing in front of a wall or other surface the notes can stick to, challenge your child to memorize the verses one word at a time, adding a sticky note each time and saying all the words that are already stuck to the wall.

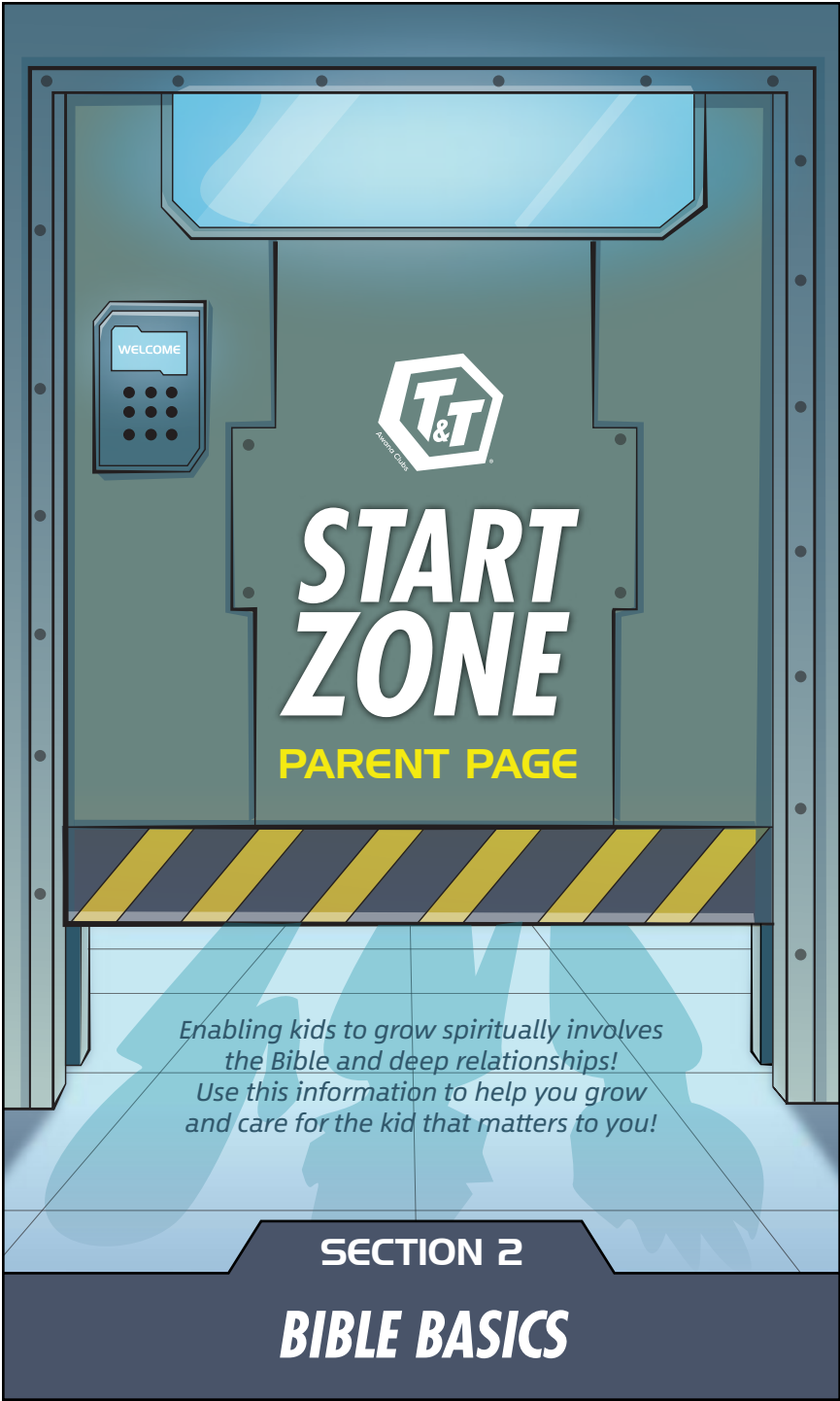
